Is neoclassical growth theory dead? Why have the biggest industrial economies stagnated since the financial crisis? Is the idea of a competitive threat from China due to a lack of understanding of economic theory or is it a genuine danger to our standard of living?

At this event David Sainsbury will set out a new theory of economic growth which explains why the G7 countries have experienced slowing rates of labour productivity over the last twenty five years, the so-called 'productivity puzzle', and put forward policies which governments can adapt to innovate and restore their rates of economic growth.

Subject Masterclasses at Cambridge University

Subject Masterclasses are subject-specific events that offer academically able students in Year 12 (or equivalent) the chance to experience typical undergraduate teaching at the University of Cambridge, and to get a flavour of what it's like to be a student here. The Masterclasses cover a range of subjects and provide students with an opportunity to explore topics of interest beyond what's covered within the school curriculum.

Each Masterclass includes:

- two taster lectures delivered by leading academic staff from the University
- the opportunity to discuss and ask questions
- an introduction to the Cambridge admissions process
- the opportunity to hear about life as a Cambridge student from current undergraduates

Booking is essential and is open to individuals at a cost of £20 (to cover event costs). Funded places are available for anyone eligible for Free School Meals and for children in care.

Engineering Access Day - Cambridge

Cambridge University Engineering Society are pleased to introduce a new Access Day for Year 12 students interested in Engineering.

During this day students will attend lectures and classes taught by Cambridge academics, as well as have the opportunity to walk through the historic city centre and enjoy a student-style lunch at Trinity College. Students will also get the chance to meet current fellows and undergraduates, and gain a fantastic insight into what it's like to live and study at Trinity. There will also be sessions on choosing a course, applications and student life. The Access Day is free, including all food costs, and there are funds available to cover travel expenses to and from Cambridge for those who need it.
